

Explanation of Daily Work Grades —Dr. Irvin’s 1301 Class

Late work gets no credit.

Work that does not follow directions either in content or length does not get full credit.

| Assignment | Points Credit | Explanation |
|---------------------------------|---------------|--|
| E/G/W | 8 | poor effort gets half credit, 4 pts. |
| Process Journals | 12 | 8 pts. Initial response short initial response = 4 of 8 pts. 1 pt. each for 4 ah-hah responses = 12 pts. |
| Freewriting Journals | 16 | 4 pts. each, 4 per week = 16 pts. |
| Peer Response + Writing Reviews | 20 | 4 pts. each peer response = 12 pts. 8 pts. for writing review = 8 pts. +2 pts. for extra-credit peer response Short, rushed, superficial peer responses may not get full credit. Writing Reviews under required minimum length will get half credit (4 pts.) |
| On-Time Drafts | 20 | For a draft to be counted as “on time” for this portion of your grade, the entire writing feedback loop must be completed: draft + all peer response+ writing review--all completed and <u>on time</u> . Draft 1 on-time = 6 pts. / late = 0 pts. Draft 2 on-time = 6 pts. / late = 0 pts. Draft 3 on-time = 8 pts. / late = 0 pts. Total Possible Points per Essay = 20 |

Remember, Essays and Essay Drafts do not get a grade on the writing quality.

- The grade, for example, for Essay #1-Draft #1 out of 20 is actually for the peer responses and writing review.
- The grade for Essay #1 in the “On Time Drafts” portion of your grade is actually for whether you had all your drafts in on time.
