Late work gets no credit.
Work that does not follow directions either in content or length does not get full credit.

| E/G/W | 8 | poor effort gets half credit, 4 pts. |
| Process Journals | 12 | 8 pts. Initial response <br> short initial response $=4$ of 8 pts. <br> 1 pt. each for 4 ah-hah responses = 12 pts. |
| Freewriting <br> Journals | 16 | 4 pts. each, 4 per week = 16 pts. |
| Peer Response + <br> Writing Reviews | 20 | 4 pts. each peer response = 12 pts. <br> 8 pts. for writing review = 8 pts. <br> +2 pts. for extra-credit peer response |
| On-Time Drafts | 20 | Short, rushed, superficial peer responses may <br> not get full credit. Writing Reviews under <br> required minimum length will get half credit <br> (4 pts.) |
| For a draft to be counted as "on time" for this <br> portion of your grade, the entire writing <br> feedback loop must be completed: draft + all <br> peer response + writing review--all completed <br> and on time. |  |  |

Remember, Essays and Essay Drafts do not get a grade on the writing quality.

- The grade, for example, for Essay \#1-Draft \#1 out of 20 is actually for the peer responses and writing review.
- The grade for Essay \#1 in the "On Time Drafts" portion of your grade is actually for whether you had all your drafts in on time.
