## Why Read a Book?

Many colleges and universities have their freshman read an important contemporary book during their first semester. Not only does reading this type of book reinforce one of the primary missions of higher education—to help you learn about the world you live in—but it provides an opportunity to introduce freshman to the kind of critical reading, thinking, and discussion that will be central to their experience in college. ## Why Read THIS Book?

The Faraway Brothers is an important and timely book. It deals with one of the most important topics in the last ten years—immigration. Published in 2017, it traces the journey of two Salvadoran immigrants to America. Through their story, we come to understand more about this important issue to our country.

#### What Will We Do With This Book?

We will write Essay #3 and #4 over the book. Essay #3 will be an essay where you analyze the book. Essay #4 will be a personal inquiry project where you do some research over a topic of interest to you that you discover from the book.

## When Should I Have the Book Read By?

The target date for completing the book is between Oct. 8 - 12th. That means you should be reading the book while we are working on Essays #1 and #2 (roughly 35 pages per week).
